<u>Minutes of the sixth meeting of Sub- Committee of National Council for</u> <u>Vocational Training (NCVT) on Training Norms and Courses held on 28th</u> <u>February, 2017</u>

A meeting of Sub-committee of NCVT on Training Norms and Courses was held on 28th February, 2017 in Committee Room, Shivaji Stadium Annexe Building, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Shri Asheesh Sharma, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. List of participants is at Annex-I.

DG/JS welcomed the members and requested Shri R. K. Pathak, Director of Training to take up agenda items for discussion. Initiating the discussion, Director of Training informed the members about the agendas for discussion and thereafter point-wise agenda items were taken up for discussion.

Agenda Item no. 1: Approval of the Curricula of six CTS trades under 'Dual System of Training'

Director of Training briefed the members about the 'Dual System of Training' and informed that main purpose of this system is to have better connect with the industry. He further informed that the theory and some basic practicals are covered in the ITI itself and the remaining practicals are covered in the industry.

Shri L. K. Mukherjee, Dy. Director, CSTARI explained the structure of courses under 'Dual System of Training' and presented the salient points for the following re-structured trades proposed under dual system:

He also informed the members that requests have been received from ITIs for introduction of above trades in dual mode. DDG(T) enquired whether industry will come forward for signing MoUs for these courses. On this, DG/JS informed that these courses are to be run in partnership with the industry and by introducing courses under 'Dual System', enabling provision is being made for the industry to come forward. Further, DG/JS suggested adding some theory portion relevant to training in the industry, if it is not covered in theory being taught in institute, and also desired to involve training schools of industry in future while re-structuring the curricula in dual mode.

Sub-committee approved the six trades mentioned in the table above under 'Dual System of Training'.

Agenda Item no. 2: Approval of 25 MES courses under the Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Construction, Fisheries, Forest, Horticulture, Electronics, Sericulture, Textile, Fire & Safety, Iron & Steel and Medical & Nursing Sectors
