**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject: Compliance with the Judgment dated 03.07.2026 passed by the Hon'ble Court of Delhi in W.P.(C) 7390/2026 Jay Bajarangbali Private ITI Versus Directorate General of Training-reg**

The Petitioner institute i.e Jay Bajarangbali Private ITI (**PR0900225**) has filed the above subject Writ Petition seeking following relief : -

- i. *“A Civil Writ of Certiorari for seeking quashing of de-affiliation of the Petitioner ITI; as made by the Standing Committee on Accreditation & Affiliation, of the Respondent No.1 in its 22nd Meeting held on 16.06.2025; and communicated vide Letter dated 04.07.2025 of the Respondent No.1; and/or*
- ii. *a Civil Writ of Mandamus for seeking direction to the Respondent No.1 to restore the Affiliation of the Petitioner Institution, with its original Trades and Units forthwith; and/or*
- iii. *a Civil Writ of Mandamus for seeking direction to the Respondent No.1 to activate the “Skill India Digital Hub” [SIDH] portal, pertaining to the Petitioner, enabling it to access the same and perform all activities relating to the Students/Trainees admitted by it for / during the Academic Session 2025-27 i.e. prior to de-affiliation; and/or*
- iv. *a Civil Writ of Mandamus for seeking further consequent direction to both the Respondents, to take all the necessary steps to migrate the aforesaid data from State Council for Vocational Training Portal “SCVT” portal to “SIDH” portal, expeditiously and preferably within a period of one week, so as to enable the Petitioner to download the hall tickets qua the aforesaid Students / Trainees, for appearing in the All India Trade Test-2026.”*

2. The petitioner shifted its institution to a new location. However, the request for shifting was rejected, and the institute was de-affiliated from its old location by the impugned decision taken in the 22nd SCAA meeting on the ground that, despite having been granted three opportunities during the 17th, 18th, and 20th SCAA meetings, the petitioner failed to rectify the deficiencies pointed out by the SCAA. It was contended by the petitioner that 120 trainees had already been enrolled through the State Admission Portal and, therefore, sought a direction permitting those trainees to appear in the examinations. After hearing the submissions of the parties at length, the Hon'ble Court disposed of the matter by order dated 03.07.2026. The operative portion of the said order is reproduced below:

*“7. Let the petitioner apply for the same for which the respondent no. 1 shall open the portal from 2 weeks from today for a period of 2 weeks.*

*8. Since the petitioner is an existing institute, the rules applicable to an existing institute shall be applicable to the petitioner.*

9. *As far as the 120 students are concerned, the respondent no. 1 shall ensure that the said students are accommodated in the nearby institutes within a period of 4 weeks from today and since the petitioner would be unable to provide a platform for conducting of examination, respondent no. 1 shall ensure that the exam in the form of supplementary exam is organised within a period of 3 months from today to enable the student to clear their first year of vocational training.*

10. *Respondent No. 2 shall give necessary assistance to respondent No. 1 in this regard.*

11. *The list of available institutes in the vicinity shall be provided by respondent No. 2 within 2 weeks from the date of communication of the order by respondent No. 1. The petitioner may also assist the respondent No. 1 in the said exercise.*

12. *Since, the petitioner after de-affiliation has continued with the education of the children, the petitioner shall **refund the entire fee** of the students within a period of 4 weeks from today.*

13. *This is a digitally signed order. The petition is disposed of in the aforesaid terms.”*

3 Since the petitioner ITIs have been de-affiliated due to lack of requisite infrastructure at shifted place, therefore, in compliance with the judgment dated 03.07.2026, and considering the future of the trainees, it has been decided by the DGT that the data of the trainees, claimed to have been admitted by petitioner institute shall be reallocated in another affiliated institutes. The **following procedure** shall be adopted for the said transfer process:

3.1 The petitioner institute shall refund the entire fees to the trainees and submit the list of the trainees who seeks to take admission in affiliated institutes to the state directorate within 30 days from the date of issuance of this letter. The petitioner shall also submit an undertaking to the state directorate stating that all fees and charges received from the trainees have been returned to concerned, in compliance with the Hon’ble Court's direction.

3.2 Subsequently, the State Directorate shall identify DGT-affiliated institutes willing to admit these trainees against available vacant seats. The affected trainees may take fresh admission in such institutes based on their eligibility and upon payment of the prescribed fees. The state directorate may submit the details of the trainees and the institutes for transferring the data from state admission portal to SIDH portal within 2 weeks thereafter.

3.3 The DGT shall facilitate the State Directorate in transferring the data of such trainees from the State Admission Portal to the SIDH Portal for the purpose of generating their Permanent Registration Numbers (PRNs).

3.4 Upon generation of the PRNs, the trainees shall be permitted to appear in the ensuing supplementary/leftover examination in accordance with the examination guidelines likely to be notified in September 2026.

3.5 It is clarified that it shall be the sole responsibility of the petitioner institute to refund the fees and return all original documents collected from the trainees, if any, at the time of admission. The DGT shall not be held responsible for any dispute arising between the petitioner institutes and their trainees in respect of fees, documents, or any other related matters in future.

3.6 The petitioner institutes may submit a fresh application for affiliation using their existing institute code within four weeks from the date of issuance of this letter through the

DGT Affiliation Portal ([ITI Affiliation Portal](#)). In case of any difficulty, the petitioner institute may raise a support ticket through the Help Desk available on the portal.

This issues with approval of the competent authority in compliance with the judgment dated 03.07.2026 passed by the Hon'ble Court of Delhi in W.P.(C) 7390/2026.
