OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Final compliance with the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh Interim Order dated 25.09.2025 passed in I.A. No. 17377/2025 in W.P.(C) No. 22405/2025 (Utsav Private ITI vs. Union of India & Others) – regarding.

Whereas a Writ Petition WP No. 22405 of 2025 (UTSAV PRIVATE ITI Vs UNION OF INDIA AND OTHERS) has been filed by the petitioner institute i.e Utsav Private Industrial Training Institute (**PR23000776**) at the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Jabalpur, seeking following relief by way of this writ petition -

“In light of the facts stated herein above, it is most humbly prayed before this Hon'ble Court that court may: -

Issue a writ of certiorari and quash the decision taken by the Respondent for de-affiliating the petitioner's ITI and further quash the entry mentioned/uploaded in the (Annexure P/9).

Issue a writ of Mandamus and declare the all proceeding illegal related to the de-affiliating the petitioner's ITI on the ground of admission since last 3 years including de-affiliation order, which was not been served to the petitioner.

Issue a writ in the nature of mandamus to direct the Respondent No. 4 to 6 to include the name of the petitioner institute in the portal regarding to choice filling for the purpose of counselling for the purpose of enrolment of the student in the petitioner institute.

Issue a writ in the nature of mandamus to direct the Respondent No. 4 to 6 to include the name of the petitioner institute as affiliated institute in the portal.

Issue any other writ, order or direction as this Hon'ble court deems fit”

2. Whereas, the petitioner institute was granted affiliation in Electrician trade with 6 (2+2+2) units initially. However, the institute was de-affiliated partially vide DGT Order dated 17.01.2025 on account of having zero admissions for the last six years (2018-2023). In pursuance of the said order, the trade Electrician – 5 (1+2+2) units have been de-affiliated.

3. Whereas the petitioner institute has filed an Interim Application (IA) 17377/2025 in WPC 22405/2025 before the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh, seeking permission to participate in the counselling process for the academic session 2025-26.

4. Whereas the Hon'ble High Court vide its interim order dated 25.09.2025 in I.A. No. 17377/2025 has granted the interim relief to the petitioner, permitting the petitioner to participate in the counselling process of session 2025. The relevant part of the order is reproduced as follows:

“The respondents are directed to permit the petitioner to participate in on-going counselling scheduled upto 30.09.2025. However, mere permission to participate in on-going counselling will not create any right in favour of the petitioner and the same will be subject to final outcome of this writ petition.”

5. Whereas, in compliance with the Hon’ble Court’s interim order dated 25.09.2025, DGT has issued an OM 17.10.2025. The relent part of the decision in OM is extracted as hereunder-

*“5.1 Since the Electrician – 5 (1+2+2) units have already been de-affiliated vide DGT Order dated 17.01.2025 due to continuous non-operation for the last six years, and upon due consideration of the grievance submitted by the petitioner, the impugned **Show Cause Notice dated 22.04.2025** for de-affiliation of Electrician – 6 (2+2+2) units is hereby **withdrawn, qua the petitioner institute.***

5.2 The one unit (Shift-I/Unit-I) of the Electrician trade is presently affiliated on the NCVT portal. Accordingly, the State Directorate may transfer the data of the trainees admitted in this affiliated unit from the State Admission Portal to the SIDH portal as per the prescribed API data transfer schedule.

5.3 The petitioner institute is further permitted to provisionally admit trainees in the de-affiliated Electrician – 5 (1+2+2) units for the academic session 2025, specifically in compliance with the Hon’ble Court’s interim directions. The petitioner shall inform all such trainees that their admissions are provisional in nature and subject to the final outcome of W.P.(C) No. 22405/2025. The petitioner shall also submit an undertaking to this effect to the State Directorate.

5.4 The petitioner shall submit the details of the trainees claimed to be admitted in the Electrician – 5 (1+2+2) units till admission cut-off date 17.10.2025 along with trainees’ basic details, Admission Receipt number, and the amount of fees collected from the trainee, to the State directorate within 15 days from issue of this letter. After verification, the State Directorate shall transfer the verified trainees’ data from the State Admission Portal to the SIDH portal as per the API data transfer schedule.

5.5 A joint inspection will also be conducted by the State Directorate and RDSDE to verify the availability and adequacy of infrastructure, equipment, and other training facilities for the trainees admitted by the petitioner institute, and to submit a report to DGT.

6. Whereas, the petitioner has approached this Hon’ble Court in the contempt petition CONC-6441-2025 seeking relief to initiate contempt proceedings for wilfully disobeying the order dated 25.09.2025 passed by the learned single Bench in Writ Petition No. 22405/2025. The contempt petition was connected with main petition as per judgment dated 26.11.2025. Thereafter, no order has been passed in the main petition.

7. Whereas, pursuant to DGT Office Memorandum dated 17.10.2025, a joint inspection of the Petitioner Institute was conducted on **13.11.2025**. During the inspection, it was found that the Institute premises were locked and that no training activities were being conducted. The inspection team further reported that the Institute had not been operational since the year 2020. It is pertinent to submit that prior intimation regarding the inspection was duly communicated to the Petitioner Institute through DGT OM dated 17.10.2025 and also by Government ITI, Rewa vide communication dated 12.11.2025. Despite such advance notice, the Institute remained closed at the time of inspection.

8. Whereas in compliance to the DGT OM 17.10.2025, para 5.4, the Petitioner has **merely furnished an Excel sheet containing the details of the trainees without submitting any supporting documentary evidence**, such as admission receipt numbers, fee receipts, or other records evidencing completion of the admission process vide its letter dated 19.06.2026. That the DGT has granted additional relief to admit the trainees till cut- off date 17.10.2025 for session 2025-26, however it is required to verify the trainee's data as per the admission procedure before onboarding them on the SIDH portal.

9. Whereas, the present condition and status of the Petitioner Institute do not indicate that training activities are being conducted in accordance with the prescribed norms. That the DGT is duty bound and under an obligation to protect and promote the welfare of the future trainees who may seek admissions at the training institute in the ongoing counselling process and the DGT cannot overlook the welfare of the trainees.

10. Whereas, in adherence to the principles of natural justice, the petitioner institute was afforded a final opportunity vide DGT email dated 22.06.2026 in reply to the petitioner letter 19.06.2026 to **show cause** as to why its affiliation should not be cancelled on account of the closure and being no training activities conducted on the premises of the ITI. It was categorically directed that the explanation must be comprehensive and supported with relevant documents, including proof of **operational address and geo-tagged photographs** of the infrastructure and machineries and the training records. The inspection report 13.11.2025 was also shared with the petitioner along with photographs. The **Show Cause Notice was duly communicated** to the petitioner through its registered email address < utsavpvtiti47@gmail.com> as well as the email address previously furnished by the petitioner for correspondence < utsavpvtiti2017@gmail.com>.

11. Whereas it was categorically mentioned in SCN 22.06.2026 that the mere furnishing of trainee data in an Excel sheet does not establish the genuineness of the admissions. The Petitioner had furnished a list of **18 trainees in the rejoinder** filed before this Hon'ble Court in the contempt proceedings. However, vide letter dated 19.06.2026, the Petitioner has claimed admissions in respect of **23 trainees**. This inconsistency clearly casts doubt on the veracity of the information furnished by the Petitioner.

12. Whereas, considering the future interests of the trainees, the Petitioner was specifically directed via SCN 22.06.2026 to submit documentary evidence in support of the admissions claimed, including admission receipt numbers, fee receipts, and attendance records of all the trainees, in accordance with DGT Office Memorandum dated 17.10.2025. Accordingly, the request for uploading trainee data on the SIDH Portal could only be considered only after receipt and verification of the aforesaid records.

12. Whereas the petitioner was directed to furnish its reply to DGT within two weeks from the date of issuance of the notice, i.e., on or before 05.07.2026. However, the petitioner has refrained from submitting any reply to DGT.

13. Now, **therefore**, it is clearly evident that the petitioner institute does not comply with the prescribed affiliation norms. Further, the petitioner failed to furnish any reply regarding the trainee data claimed to have been admitted for the Academic Year 2025–26, in compliance to the interim order dated 25.09.2025 passed in I.A. No. 17377/2025. Multiple opportunities have been provided by DGT via its OM 17.10.2025 and SCN dated 22.06.2026, however, the petitioner failed to submit any reply for fee receipts, admission records, or any other supporting documents to establish the genuineness of the admissions. Consequently, the trainee data claimed to be admitted by the petitioner for session 2025-26 in compliance to Interim Order dated 25.09.2025 could not be uploaded on the SIDH Portal.

13. It is also noted that the last date for mapping approved instructors against the eligible ITI Trade–Shift–Units (ITSUs) through the ITI Approver Login is 20.07.2026 and the last date for admission for the Academic Year 2026–27 is 08.08.2026. In view of the non-compliance with the prescribed norms, the deficient condition of the institute, and in order to safeguard the interests and future of the trainees, the petitioner institute is hereby **de-affiliated** with immediate effect. Accordingly, no fresh admissions shall be permitted from the **Academic Session 2026–27 onwards**.

14. However, the petitioner is at liberty to submit a **fresh application for affiliation** in accordance with the Affiliation Norms, 2025, through the DGT Portal.
